## Green Days

In June everything turns green. Of course, the trees and the grass outside have been green for a while. We are entering a time in the church calendar which has gone by various names: 'Sundays after Pentecost', 'Sundays after Trinity', and 'Ordinary Time.' Each of these names puts a bit of a different emphasis on this season. However, no matter what we call it, the season is cloaked in green.

The church year is basically divided into two halves. The first part of the church year, beginning with Advent, is a series of liturgical celebrations revolving around the major events of the life of Jesus. Advent is a time of preparation for Christmas, the coming of Jesus into the world and also a time of preparation for his second coming at the end of history. The

Christmas season leads to Epiphany when we remember the "Manifestation" (that's what 'Epiphany' means), the revelation or unveiling of Christ to the whole world.

Traditionally in the West this season begins by remembering the story of the coming of gentiles - the magi - to worship Jesus. The Eastern Church emphasizes the story of Jesus' Baptism and the manifestation of the Trinity itself - in the story of the Baptism of Jesus, the Father's voice acknowledges Jesus as the Son and the Holy Spirit anoints him for his mission. From Epiphany we move to Lent, the great time of repentance in preparation for the yearly remembrance of the passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus. The whole first half of the year is brought to (another!) climax in Pentecost, the birth of the church, and Trinity Sunday, when we remember that the life of Christ on earth is in fact the culmination of the drama of the Triune God's action of salvation for the whole world.

Having gone through this dramatic sequence of fasts and feasts, the second half of the church year might appear to be a bit staid. In the vestments and church adornments we see no purple, white or red - just miles and miles of green: 'Ordinary Time'.

But that is life, isn't it? We all experience times of deep sadness and grief, times of preparation, times of great joy and celebration...but much of the stuff of life is, well, 'ordinary', day to day, routine, occupied with the common every day rituals of eating, sleeping, working and cleaning. When I was growing up I remember being reminded that even the most famous and exalted of people 'put on their pants one leg at a time.' Canadians were reminded that even the Queen had to wash her face and go to the dentist!

Calling this time the 'Sundays after Pentecost' reminds us that all of the Christian experience, even at its most mundane, is life lived under the guidance of the Spirit. The title, 'Sundays after Trinity' reminds us that just as Jesus lived his

earthly life in constant fellowship with his Father and in the power of the Spirit, so our own existence should be a walking with Jesus for the glory of God the Father, animated by the Spirit. And so, during these Sundays the gospel readings take us through Jesus' ministry of teaching and healing, so that our lives can be shaped more and more by his life.

These Sundays after Pentecost and Trinity Sunday are *wonderfully* 'Ordinary.' Wendy recently reminded me of a quote from Mother Theresa of Calcutta: "it's not so much what you do but the love with which you do it." 'Ordinary Time' teaches us that God loves the common, the habitual. He blesses it. Just as he uses bread and wine to teach of his self-giving love, just as he uses water to incorporate us into his body, the church, so God takes our everyday routine realities and in each one gives us the opportunity to love him and to love one another.

May this year's 'Ordinary Time' be a season of green growth for all of us. May we be continually renewed by the Spirit of Pentecost, continually aware of the presence of God's Triune life, and continually filled with love in the midst of each of life's circumstances.


